



Intersection is an area of the roadway where two or more roads cross or meet. An intersection can be four-way (or *crossroads*), three-way or more ways.




So *crossroads* means an intersection of two or more roads.



Roundabout is a place where three or more roads join and traffic must go around a circular area in the middle, rather than straight across.

> Pass the roundabout.






How to give an address?

- You should learn how to give an address.



"Go straight. Take Yadegar highway and you'll see and take North Chamrah highway. Turn right."





- "Go straight when you're in Parkway crossroads. Turn left, take Moqadas Ardebili Street and then after five minutes you'll see Paladiom shopping center."
- Please give the exact address to help him/her find the address easily.
- Try to give the quickest/fastest/ nearest way.

2. Around Town

Where can I find a grocery store/ grocery stores?



Grocery stores are places where you can buy food.

If you don't wanna eat at restaurant, you can go to the grocery stores and get something to eat.

"Where is the nearest grocery store/ nearest restaurant?"

Where is the hospital?

A hospital may be needed if you or someone you're traveling with is sick or injured.

When you get injured or get sick, you have to go to the hospital. But how? You should ask questions.

"Excuse me; where is the nearest hospital?"



Where is the bank?

If you run out of money, you have to go to a bank to get more money.

- "Where is the bank?"
- "Where is the nearest bank?"
- ❖ I'd just like to go to the bank to get money/ to withdraw*/ to deposit*.
- "How far is it to ...?"
- "How far is it?"
- "How far is it to go to the bank / shopping mall?"


Direction

How to ask? / How to answer the questions?

- It's to the right/ left.
- It's straight ahead.
- You're heading in a right (correct) direction.
- You should keep going.
- It's at the corner.
- Two blocks ahead
- Two streets ahead



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*Withdraw: to take money out from the account

*Deposit: to put money in the account



Talking to the travel agency

"I'm going to travel to China."


"How long will you stay there?/ How long are you going to stay there?"

"I'll stay there for seven days."

"Will you go on this trip first class or economy class?"



- "First class is a little expensive."
- "Which airline?"
- "What time is my flight?"
- "Is that a connecting flight (stopover) or a direct flight?"
- "How long does it take? (my stopover)/ How long should I stay in Dubai? Two or three hours?"



3. At The Airport

Lots of questions you may ask when you are at the airport.

"I would like (to have) some water."

"What time do you have to be at the airport?"

"What's your flight number?"

"What time does the plane <u>land in/arrive</u> <u>at/</u> <u>get to</u> Tokyo?"

"Have you packed/unpacked your suitcases?"

Grammar Tip:

l would like (I'd like) + noun

➤ I would like some water.

| would like (I'd like) + to + verb

"Have you handed in your passport/ documents? It's necessary for boarding the plane."





*Hand in something: to give something to someone in a position of authority تمویل دادن

❖ "What time is my flight?"

Airports are not always great for communicating travel times, but this question will help you not miss your flight and get to your English-speaking destination.

"What airline am I flying with?"

Airline is a company which owns the plane you are flying on.

❖ "Where is my gate?"



A **gate** is the point of entry to the airplane and it's the place where you'll wait before boarding* your flight.



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*Board: get on to

❖ "Where is the restroom?"

A **restroom** is a place where you go to freshen up and use the toilet. [This phrase has many variations. In different countries people call this room in many different ways; **bathroom/washroom/toilet**. They're all equivalent.]





- "How much does this magazine cost?"
- "How much does it cost?"



Who wants to travel without some entertainments?

By asking **how much** a particular magazine or book (like publication with short articles) costs, you configure out how much **money** you have to pay for it.

You can also replace the word "magazine" with the other words for items you may want to buy; water bottle, snack...

Check in the baggage/luggage



They're beginning to check in in one minute.

Get your baggage checked in.

We must get/have our baggage checked in.

You can put your baggage up here.



Grammar Tip:

get + something + p.p

We form the standard passive with be + -ed form. We form the get passive with get + -ed form

We use the **get** passive especially in **informal** speaking. We place a little more emphasis on the nature of the action itself or on the person involved in the action.

- l got my hair/car washed. (Someone washed my hair/car.)
- > Our car got stolen last night. (Someone stole our car last night.)

The clerk will ask you some questions. You should answer all of them carefully. Be careful not to violate (break) the law.

"Each passenger is allowed to have 20Kg weight freely."

If you have excess weight, you have to pay for it. They'll charge you.

- "Can I carry this bag/briefcase with me on the airplane?"
- "I'm sorry. You're not allowed to carry this with you on the airplane."



- "You have too much excess weight."
- "Stick the stickers on your suitcase not to get confused."
- * "You can choose your seat on gate 3"
- "I'd like a window/ gang seat."
- Here is your boarding pass; enjoy your flight.



*Excess: additional amount, an amount that is more than acceptable, expected, or reasonable.


- Excess food
- > Excess weight? So you have to pay extra money.

On the airplane

Meal is a collection of foods served at one time. All airlines provide meals so it may be good to ask if you'll be <u>fed</u>.

- * Are meals included?
- May I have something to eat/ drink?





If you just want to listen to the news or podcasts, especially Yum Yum podcasts, you definitely need to have headphones.

"Excuse me Sir/Madam; ..." (when you want to ask a question from flight attendants.)

"Excuse me Madam, may I have something to eat or drink?"



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You definitely need to <u>acknowledge</u>* the flight attendants.

- "May I purchase headphones?"
- "Excuse me, Sir; I'd like (to have) a pizza/ burger."
- "I want to listen to CD's podcasts."
- "I want to listen to the MP3s and I need headphones."
- ❖ "What time is it?"



Remember:

- ✓ Boarding on the airplane
- ✓ Being at the airport



*Acknowledge: show that one has noticed or recognized (someone) by making a gesture (like smiling) or greeting like saying: "Hi, how are you?" A long flight is really tiring. You should amuse yourself $Not\ to\ waste\ your\ time.$

Time is priceless. Time is really valuable. We should appreciate it.


You can listen to music, enjoy sleeping, get refreshed but don't get bored.



At the customs

After the airport and airplane, come the most stressful experiences for travelers.

In this part you have to explain why you have arrived in the country and tell the officers what your intentions are.



- "I have a connecting flight."
- "I'll be boarding another plain to go somewhere else."

If you're arriving in a country where you'll not be staying, this is how you say you'll be boarding another plane to go somewhere else.

If you haven't a connecting flight (stopover), then you say that you are not *gonna* stay there. For example, if you want to go from Tehran to Malaysia, then you just have a stopover in Dubai. So you say: "I have a connecting flight."

- "I'm traveling for leisure."
- "It's for visiting only."
- "I'm not gonna stay there for long time. It's just for visiting/weekend/holiday/vacation/leisure."

If you're traveling for fun or vacation, you should use these phrases to let the officer know.

- "I'm traveling for work."
- ❖ "I'll be here for 10/15/20 days."

For example, if you're traveling on behalf of your company or you're on business, then you say "I'm traveling for work" or "I'll be here for 10/15/20 days."

Let's review important sentences.

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- "I'd like to eat something."
- "I'd like to have something."
- "What time is my flight?"
- "What airline am I flying with?"
- "Where is the restroom?((Restroom=Toilet= Bathroom=Washroom)
- "Excuse me Sir, where is the restroom?"
- "Where is my gate?"
- "Where is my gate?"
- "How much does the magazine cost?"
- "Are meals included or not?"

A **meal** is a collection of foods served at one time. Not all airlines. Then you should ask if you'll be fed on this flight?

4. At The Restaurant

After a long day, exploring food is always a welcome break.

You wanna go to the restaurant.

Remember:


- You are at the restaurant.
- × You are-in-the restaurant



* "We want a table for three people". (How many of you? two or three or four?)

How many people will be eating at this restaurant?

- "I'd like to drink soda/ water/ coffee."
- "I'd like to drink something."
- "I'd like to have something."
- "I'll have soup. (I will have soup.)"
- "I'll have chicken/ beef."
- "I'd like a pizza."
- "May I see the menu?"
- "What type of food do you have?"



You must be very careful what type of meal you wanna eat.

You go to a restaurant which is really famous.



Go to the restaurant that most of the people go, because it shows that the restaurant is really successful.

You go and search lots of information.

Of course for searching you need to speak English. You should speak English to ask lots of questions.

- "We don't wanna explore, because I can't speak English."
- "Because I can't speak English, I won't explore a lot."
- "If I speak English, I'll be the best adventurer*.
- "I'll go and find and identify the best, unique and intact places.
- "I'll have a hamburger.

Hamburger is a heavy food; it's a high calorie food.

- "I'll have chicken. I don't eat beef."
- "I'll try some chicken."
- "I'll have burgers."

Burger is quiet common; almost all the restaurants have it.

You just explain to the receptionist. You should explain what type of burger you want. For example, "it comes with spicy or with/without mushroom...", because lots of different burgers they have.

You should answer/ explain what you want so comprehensive not to make a mistake.

If you don't wanna make a mistake, just improve your everyday conversation.

"I'd like <u>dessert</u>*/sweet after the <u>main course</u>* for digesting the food."

You should first eat an <u>appetizer</u>*, then the main course and have the dessert at last.

*Adventurer

- *Dessert: sweet dish you eat after the main course to help for digesting the food
- *Appetizer: Small dish that you eat before the main course.

You have to pay the bill*.

You have to go to the check out/ cashier/ register/ cashier. They will help you <u>swipe the card*</u>.

Maybe you have to pay by credit card or you have to pay cash.

- How much is this sim card?
- * "How much is it?"



*Complain: express dissatisfaction or annoyance about something کردن



As you know, mobile phones/cars have become an indispensable* part of our lives.

- "She is always text massaging/ texting."
- "I'll text you."
- "I'll send you sms."
- "She'll text me."
- "I'll text her."



^{*} Indispensable: Essential فروری ، فیر قابل انگار

❖ "Yesterday I was cut off* for not having paid my mobile bill twice."



- "Do you know what her/his mobile number is?"
- ❖ "Call me on my cell."
- "Whenever I dial your number, it is engaged/ busy."

A mobile phone makes you contactable*.



Contact (verb): the action of communicating or meeting.

- *Contactable (adjective): able to be communicated with
 - The manager is not *contactable* at the moment.

If I were in your shoes*, I would put my cell in the garbage can.

Why would you do that?

because your cell phone does not have Bluetooth.

Oh, yeah, I'm sorry but my cell phone cell phone does not have Bluetooth.

OK, can you send me that file through Telegram?

Oh telegram? I'm not using Telegram. I'm using Whatsapp.

Ok send me that file through Whatsapp. OK?

All right.





*If I were in your shoes: used when you want to tell someone what you would do in their situation.

If I were in your shoes, I'd buy a house instead of this expensive car.

Where Aren't You Allowed To Use Your Cell Phone?
